Job Summary

The special procedures technician will be responsible for radiation functions for special procedures and other interventional examinations.

Duties

- 1. Greets patients by confirming patient identification; reviewing imaging request; checking for special instructions; confirming anticipated services with patient
- 2. Gains patient cooperation by reducing anxieties; providing explanations of imaging procedures; explaining equipment; answering questions
- 3. Provide timely and accurate assessment, identification and delivery of special procedures or other interventional examination services to access patients
- 4. Ensure file systems are set-up properly
- 5. Assist in transporting patients
- 6. Ensure adequate inventory of supplies and contrast availability
- 7. Document supplies used during procedures for utilization and billing purposes
- 8. Maintain accurate and complete medical records of radiological procedures
- 9. Enter pertinent information in computer system to assist in statistical, research and patient follow up
