Oroville Hospital is proud to have expanded our service lines, adopted innovative technology, and recruited top-tier talent in 2024. In addition, we received accreditation of psychiatric graduate medical education, which allows our physicians to train and educate medical students during their final years of schooling. The inaugural residency class will begin training at Oroville Hospital's institute in July. As we work towards shaping the future of healthcare, our mission to deliver the highest quality of care to patients remains steadfast in our commitment to improving healthcare in our region.

We added new specialties to meet the needs of our growing community, which include Plastic Surgery and Thoracic Surgery, Urogynecology, as well as integrated new technology advancements such as the Odyssey Intraocular Lens and Genius AI for mammograms. We increased access to minimally invasive and non-invasive robotic procedures with the HistoSonics Edison® System and Ion by Intuitive. We provided access to flu vaccine clinics, meal baskets, and support groups for our cancer center and stroke program, and contributed monetarily to community groups who make a positive impact.

While we grow together to make our community a stronger place, Oroville Hospital works hard every day to make sure we do our share to be a part of that growth. We continued forward progression on our five-story expansion project and anticipate it being fully operational in 2025. As one of the city's largest employers, we build upon the local economy by expanding our services and hiring numerous stable positions. 

The secondary service areas comprise the remainder of Butte County and all of Glenn County.

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Community Health Needs Assessment

Oroville Hospital conducted a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) in 2023 as required by state and federal law. The CHNA is a primary tool used by Oroville to determine its Community Benefit plan, which outlines how it will give back to the community in the form of health care and other community services to address unmet community health needs. The assessment incorporated components of primary data collection and secondary data analysis that focused on the health and social needs of the service area.

Addressing Priority Health Needs

In FY24, Oroville Hospital engaged in activities and programs that addressed the priority health needs identified in the Community Health Improvement Plan, also called the Implementation Strategy. Through a commitment of community benefit programs and resources, Oroville Hospital chose to address the following:

- Affordable Health Care
- Heart Health
- Mental Health
- Substance Abuse
- Obesity and Diabetes
- Economic Insecurity and Poverty

Selected activities and programs that highlight the hospital's commitment to address the priority health needs are detailed in the following pages.



Affordable Health Care Access

Oroville Hospital reduced accessibility barriers to vaccines through drive-through flu clinics, making it easier for those who may are more vulnerable and older generations, to receive vaccines. Drive-through access protects the whole community. The annual flu events were held in October and November of 2024, providing over 500 vaccines to the community. Vaccinations were available to community members 12 years and older, from the comfort of their vehicles. A booth was also available for walk-up flu vaccination.



Expansion

With a large patient base traveling from the Yuba City area, in 2023, Oroville Hospital opened the Yuba City Multispecialty Clinic, offering great outlets for comprehensive care. Yuba City Multispecialty provides a seamless continuum of care, ensuring that health needs are met comprehensively under one clinic.

Currently, the Yuba City Multispecialty offers:

- Primary Care Services
- Ophthalmology
- Orthopedic Surgery
- Urology
- Vascular Surgery



Heart Health Chronic Disease Monitoring and Management

Oroville Hospital's heart health programs provide resources, education and treatment. Living with chronic illnesses can be hard on individuals. Extra support is provided through Oroville Hospital's Chronic Care Management (CCM) and Remote Patient Monitoring (RPM) programs. Both programs focus on prevention education, screenings and medication management.

Cardiology Program

Additionally, the expansion of Oroville's cardiology program includes the Cardiac Catheterization Lab, providing the comprehensive cardiovascular care patients need.

Award Winning Services



Oroville Hospital Stroke Team recognized for their dedication to delivering the most effective, evidencebased treatment, ensuring high-quality care and improving patient outcomes.

Farmers Market

Oroville Hospital hosted a weekly farmers market from May through September. The market, which accepts EBT payments, allows community members access to fresh and healthy foods while supporting local farmers and vendors. The program is a response to the community's health needs.



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Mental Health Mental Well-Being Clinic

Due to the limited mental health services in Butte County, the Oroville Hospital Mental Well-Being Clinic addresses accessibility issues by offering pediatric and adult psychological assessments, psychotherapy, and medication management.



Transportation



When needed, Oroville Hospital provides inpatient transport to local psychiatric care hospitals. Drivers are crisis interventioncertified and available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. In 2024, there was over 4,600 patients transported overall for the hospital.

Psychiatry Residency Program

Mental health services have been identified as a need in the Oroville and surrounding communities due to limited available providers and services available. Because of this access gap, Oroville Hospital announced its intention to be an accredited Psychiatry Residency program through the Accreditation Council of Graduate Medical Education.

The Psychiatry Residency program is scheduled to launch in July 2025 with 10 residents and has been approved for a total of 24 residents by 2027. The psychiatric units will offer structured, multidisciplinary treatment programs that include intensive treatment, social services, and recreational therapy.



Residents in the program will rotate through various specialties, including:

- Adult Inpatient Medicine
- Consultation-Liaison Psychiatry
- Emergency Psychiatry
- Inpatient Psychiatry
- Addiction Psychiatry
- Geriatric Psychiatry, Child and Adolescent Psychiatry
- Elective Rotations

During their training at Oroville Hospital, residents will be supervised and educated by board-certified and licensed physicians, gaining valuable skills and knowledge in the field of psychiatry. With the residency program, this means physicians will be able to complete their residency program here locally, where they can then build their practice and bring the much-needed services and programs to Butte County and the surrounding communities.

Substance Abuse

Pain Management

The region has elevated usage rates of alcohol, marijuana, and prescription painkillers. Recognizing that, chronic pain visits to Oroville Hospital's Emergency Department are responded to with alternatives to controlled substances. Followup is referred to the Comprehensive Pain and Spine Center, where treatment is closely monitored to ensure the safe use of pain medications, when needed. The Comprehensive Pain and Spine Center provides two programs, one that treats addictive disorders and the other that treats patients with chronic pain, delivering specialized medical and behavioral services, including counseling, as needed.

Obesity and Diabetes Education

Oroville Hospital's healthcare services include tailored nutrition education to support a healthier lifestyle. Pediatric clinics provide comprehensive educational materials to families on lifestyle changes, developed in collaboration with the California Department of Public Health.



Surgery Access

Recognizing the need for more support and assistance in the community, Oroville Hospital launched a Bariatric surgery service line to offer accelerated weight loss options. This minimally invasive surgery is a tool that makes it easier for an individual to lose excess weight when other weight loss programs and medications, have been insufficient.

Bariatric Surgery Treats:

- Morbid Obesity
- Diabetes Mellitus II
- Obstructive Sleep Apnea
- Hypertension
- Fatty Liver Disease
- Degenerative Joint Disease
- Coronary Artery Disease



Economic Insecurity and Poverty Plumas House



Oroville Hospital operates Plumas House, a care facility established to support patients who are displaced or homeless after their discharge from the hospital. Plumas House provides a safe and supportive environment for patients to recover and heal. In 2024, 78 Plumas House residents had 24/7 direct care, daily meal service, transportation to medical and dental appointments, and access to resources to help meet their needs.

Other Community Benefit Services

Oroville Hospital provided community benefit services in addition to those programs that focused on addressing priority health needs.

Support Groups

Oroville Hospital supports the monthly Stroke and Brain Injury Support Group and the monthly Cancer Support Group. Both groups are free and open to survivors, caregivers, friends, and family, providing a safe space for individuals to heal and connect with others who share similar experiences. The support groups are educational, while still providing members the ability to have fun through music and group activities. Both the Cancer and Stroke and Brain Injury Support groups meet monthly throughout the year.

Childbirth Preparation Classes

Oroville Hospital offers a free fourweek series of childbirth preparation classes available to expecting mothers and their partners. Registered nurses and board-certified lactation consultants lead the classes. Knowing that, especially for first-time parents, childbirth can be scary and stressful, the classes support new parents with resources and hands-on practical learning in coping techniques, birth plans, stages of labor, breastfeeding, and newborn care.



Child and Family Development



Recognizing that early language exposure through talking, reading, and singing fosters optimal brain development, Oroville Hospital provides a free, age-appropriate book at every well-child visit. In partnership with the First 5 program, this initiative encourages early reading, expanding children's vocabulary, comprehension, and selfexpression.

Additional Health Professions Education Continuing Medical Education

The Oroville Hospital Continuing Medical Education (CME) program links relevant education to improved healthcare and systems improvement. The hospital's "Regularly Scheduled Series" seeks to address healthcare improvement goals, improve point-of-care performance gaps, explore technological advances, share evolving best practices, promote skill building, and identify desired clinical changes. Participants earn CME credit for the learning, with the added benefit of cross-functional improvement in communication, system-wide, between services, providers, and patients.

Additional Health Professions Education Certified Nursing Assistants

To ensure adequate and consistent staffing, Oroville Hospital offers a paid program that facilitates a smooth transition to a career in healthcare. After successfully completing the written and skills exams provided by the state, students are then placed within the facility as Certified Nursing Assistants.

The Certified Nursing Assistant program consists of:

- Eight-Week Training Program
- Earn-As-You-Learn Compensation
- Classroom Instruction
- Clinical Experience
- Certified Nursing Assistant Job Placement





Financial Summary of Community Benefit

Oroville Hospital's financial summary of community benefit for the FY24 reporting period (December 1, 2023, to November 30, 2024) is summarized in the table below. The Hospital's community benefit costs comply with the Internal Revenue Service instructions for Form 990 Schedule H. The costs are calculated using a cost-to-charge ratio for any unreimbursed services. Also included are activities that improve the community's health status. Costs for these activities include direct costs and allocated overhead costs, offset by any donations and grants received.

Oroville Hospital is committed to continuing its programs and services to meet the health needs of the community, including Affordable Health Care, Heart Health, Mental Health, Substance Use, Obesity and Diabetes, and Poverty.

Needs the Hospital Will Not Directly Address

Oroville Hospital will focus resources, partnerships and commitments on community health needs that can be addressed most effectively within our areas of focus and expertise. In the past, Oroville Hospital identified homelessness and housing, as well as prenatal and neonatal health behaviors, as needs we will not directly address. With new health services, technology, and expanded facilities, we are now addressing shortfalls in prenatal and neonatal care in our communities.

Evaluation of Impact

Oroville Hospital is committed to monitoring and evaluating key initiatives to assess the programs and activities outlined in the Implementation Strategy. We have implemented a system for collecting and documenting tracking measures, such as the number of people reached or served, and collaborative efforts to address health needs. An evaluation of the hospital's actions to address these significant health needs will be reported in the next scheduled Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA).
