Job Summary

The Pharmacist is responsible for checking and verifying physician drug orders and nurses requests for drugs, supervision of Pharmacy Assistant's work, and pharmacy students where applicable.

Duties

- 1. Safe and efficient drug distribution system
- 2. Drug therapy for patients served
- 3. Providing clinical drug information to meet needs of the physicians, nurses and patients of all ages
 - A. Interprets physician drug orders and treatment orders directly from char
 - B. May be responsible for scheduling the administration of medicine to provide optimal effect if the physician did not specify time (s) for administration
 - C. Provides clinical drug information (Pharmacological consultant) to medical and nursing staff as well as to health science student
 - D. May regularly prepare and present clinical conference to nurses on drugs in us
 - E. Maintains a patient record system, (pharmaceutical service record) to monitor a patient's drug therapy for safety and efficiency
 - F. May participate in the decision making process of drug selection
 - G. May be a member of the cardiac resuscitation (Code Blue) team
- 4. Participates in teaching of pharmacy students where applicable
- 5. Supervision of Pharmacy Assistant
- 6. Compounds prescriptions: intravenous drug mixtures
- 7. Dispenses prescriptions using accepted, good pharmaceutical technique
- 8. Responsible for control of drug inventory, supplies and floor stock
- 9. Participates when needed in pharmacy drug information service
- 10. Responsible for correct preparation of patient charge document
- 11. Participates in professional association activities

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- 12. Responsible for following department policies and procedures
- 13. Performs other related duties as required.

Qualifications

- 1. Graduate of an accredited School of Pharmacy. Licensed to practice pharmacy in the State of California
- 2. One year of hospital preferred, but not required
- 3. Must exercise sound professional judgment and use initiative consistent with knowledge of clinical drug use and the patient
- 4. Requires ability to work under general direction
- 5. Requires a very high degree of accuracy, error could cause harm to patients
- 6. Requires the safety of patients of all ages and department being supervised

Lifting Requirements

Medium – generally lifting not more than 50 lbs. maximum with frequent lifting and/or carrying of objects weighing up to 25 lbs.
